Notice Publicising a Statement of Community Consultation in accordance with Section 47(6) of the Planning Act 2008

River Thames Scheme



The Environment Agency and Surrey Councy Council are proposing to submit an application to the Secretary of State under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to authorise the River Thames Scheme ("the Scheme"). In December 2020, the Secretary of State for the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) issued a direction under section 35 of the Act, that the RTS should be treated as a Scheme of national significance for which development consent is required.

The Scheme presents a landscape-based approach to creating a healthier, more sustainable, and more resilient communities by reducing the risk of flooding and creating high quality natural environments.

The proposed Scheme includes the following key elements:

- The creation of a new flood channel in two sections through the boroughs of Runnymede and Spelthorne, totalling over 5 miles (8.5km) long;
- Capacity improvements to the Sunbury, Molesey and Teddington weirs to increase the amount of water that can flow through them. This would involve installing more gates that can be opened when river levels rise;
- Capacity improvements to the River Thames through lowering the middle part of the bed of the River Thames downstream of Desborough Cut;
- New green open spaces associated with the flood channel, with access for local communities and facilities such as sports fields, accessible pathway network, nature play spaces and associated new landscape features;
- Priority areas for habitat creation, enhancement and mitigation, which link existing and new wildlife corridors, improve fish passage and build upon the network of existing wildlife sites;
- New or improved active travel provision associated with the flood channel corridor in areas of enhanced public connection, linking to the existing network and two new pedestrian and cycle bridges across the River Thames at Chertsey and Desborough Island:
- Changes to the road layout and utilities, including temporary diversions during construction;
- Temporary construction features such as site compounds and materials processing and storage sites; and
- Temporary car parking for construction workers.

It is also the case that once built, the flood channel will be considered in legal terms to be a 'flood defence structure' and it is intended that it will also be a 'main river'. Further information on what this means is contained in the statutory consultation brochure available and on the consultation website set out below.

Statement of Community Consultation

The Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) sets out how the Environment Agency and Surrey County Council will consult with people living in the vicinity of the Scheme and how to get involved in accordance with section 47 of the Planning Act 2008. Under section 47, the Environment Agency and Surrey County Council have a duty to consult the local community about its proposals in accordance with a SoCC.
